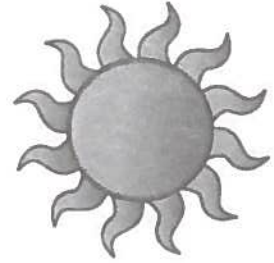

## **SOCIAL SECURITY HELPS YOU CARE FOR SENIORS**

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day is June 15. This is an opportunity for everyone, all over the world, to voice their opposition to abuses inflicted on some of the most vulnerable members of our society. For more than 80 years, Social Security has provided for the elderly as part of our everyday mission.

Sometimes a family member is incapable of representing themselves due to health reasons. Generally, we look for family or friends to serve as representative payees. Social Security's Representative Payment Program helps our beneficiaries who are incapable of managing their Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments. Family members and caregivers can protect the older people they love with help from the Representative Payee Interdisciplinary Training series. The training was developed in partnership with the Administration on Aging within the Administration for Community Living and the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau.

It educates people and organizations about the roles and responsibilities of serving as a representative payee, elder abuse and financial exploitation, and effective ways to monitor and safely conduct business with the banking community. It also teaches ways to recognize the changes in an adult or senior's ability to make sound financial decisions.

## **HOW THE WORK RULES WORK FOR YOU**

Retirement doesn't have the same meaning for everyone. Some people plan to retire and never work again. Some people plan for second careers in occupations that wouldn't have

adequately supported their families, but they do the work for pure enjoyment. Some people, whether by design or desire, choose to work part-time or seasonally to supplement their retirement income.

Retirees (or survivors) who choose to receive Social Security benefits before they reach full retirement age (FRA) and continue to work have an earnings limit. In 2017, the annual earnings limit was \$16,920 for those under FRA the entire calendar year. In 2018, it is \$17,040. If you earn over the limit, we deduct \$1 from your Social Security monthly benefit payment for every \$2 you earn above the annual limit.

In the calendar year you reach FRA, which you can check out at [www.socialsecurity.gov/planners/retire/ageincrease.html](http://www.socialsecurity.gov/planners/retire/ageincrease.html), you have a higher earnings limit. Additionally, we will only count earnings for the months prior to FRA. In 2017, the limit was \$44,880. In 2018, it is \$45,360. In the year of FRA attainment, Social Security deducts \$1 in benefits for every \$3 you earn above the limit.

There is a special rule that usually only applies in your first year of receiving retirement benefits. If you earn more than the annual earnings limit, you may still receive a full Social Security payment for each month you earn less than a monthly limit. In 2018, the monthly limit is \$1,420 for those who are below FRA the entire calendar year. The 2018 monthly limit increases to \$3,780 in the year of FRA attainment.

Once you reach FRA, you no longer have an earnings limit, and we may recalculate your benefit to credit you for any months we withheld your benefits due to excess earnings. This is because your monthly benefit amount is calculated based on a reduction for each month you receive it before your FRA. So, if you originally filed for benefits 12 months before your FRA, but earned over the limit and had two months of Social Security benefits withheld, we will adjust your ongoing monthly benefit amount to reflect that you received 10 months of benefits before your FRA, and not 12.

Most people understand that if they work while receiving benefits before FRA, their benefit may be reduced. What most people do not consider in their retirement planning is that we recalculate your Social Security monthly benefit at FRA to credit you for Social Security benefit payments withheld due to earnings over the limit. Explaining the earnings limit is another way that Social Security helps secure your today and tomorrow. Understanding both the earnings limit and the possible recalculation of your ongoing Social Security benefits will provide an additional perspective on retirement for you to consider.

### **NEW CUSTOMER DIABETIC SHOE CLINIC**

Tammy Hite, Diabetes Care Specialist from LifeCare Medical will conduct a New Customer Diabetic Shoe Clinic on Thursday, June 28 from 10:30 a.m. until 2 p.m. at the Senior Center.

As a diabetic, did you know that you are entitled to a pair of therapeutic shoes and 3 pairs of inserts per calendar year? This is a Medicare paid program. Tammy Hite will explain why the government is willing to pay for this program and the importance for you to wear good shoes. Ms. Hite can assist with picking out the style of shoe you may want. All sizes and widths are available. Please bring your Medicare number, primary doctor's name and phone number and your secondary insurance card (if you have one).

### **AMPLIFIED TELEPHONE PROGRAM**

Did you know that the Senior Center is a testing site for the State of Illinois' Amplified Telephone Program? The Illinois Telecommunications Access Corp. (ITAC) provides free amplified telephones to Illinois residents, regardless of age, in need of amplified



telephones. Individuals must be certified as needing the special phones by their physician, physician's assistant, licensed audiologist, DHS Counselors for the Deaf or Hearing Consultants for the University of IL, Specialized Care for Children. There are 5 telephones including a new cordless telephone option available for testing and selection. Applications are available at the Senior Center. Please bring a copy of your latest telephone bill and proof of residency to submit with your application. You must also have a working standard telephone service at the address on the application. Most Landline, Cable/VoIP and Cellular companies in Illinois are eligible for the phones.

## **LOW INCOME MEDICARE ASSISTANCE OPTIONS**

The second Wednesday of July an informal coffee, with Senior Center Outreach Counselor Judy Peifer will be held at the Senior Center on July 11 from 9:00am to 10:00am. The July Coffee will be an overview of the Medicare Subsidy programs. These programs are designed to assist Medicare beneficiaries (elderly or disabled) who qualify and need help with prescription drug costs or help paying Medicare premiums, deductibles or coinsurance. You may qualify for the Medicare Part D Low Income Subsidy (LIS), based on income, or the Medicare Savings Programs (MSP), based on income and assets.

Please, since Gini is usually booked a month or so in advance, we ask that you call the Senior Center at 429-1239 if you are not going to make your appointment. If someone misses 2 consecutive appointments without calling they will not be able to get another appointment for six months or pay in advance.

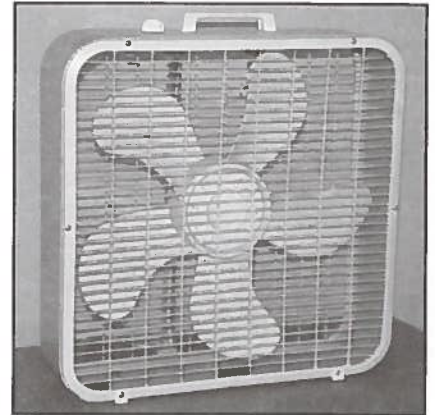


### **FATHER'S DAY PARTY!**

### **WAND FAN DRIVE**

The Decatur and Macon County community is generous enough to donate fans to be used by low income elderly residents. They are not to be given out and then sold. If anyone is found to have obtained a fan and then sold that fan they will never be eligible for another fan. **We are not providing replacement fans for fans given out last year.**
