Life Skills Employability:

The Life Skills/Employability Coordinator met with 16 individuals for the month of May. The following job linkages were made: Innovative Staff Solutions, Manpower, Caterpillar, Walmart, KFC, and a local construction company. The salary ranges for those positions were \$11/hr. to \$20/hr.

Coordinated Entry:

Dove-Homeward Bound, on behalf of the Macon County CoC, continues to provide services and have staff available 24 hours, to assist those in need of housing solutions. Please share the contact numbers with anyone you know who is experiencing housing instability issues, 217.362.7700 or 217.619.5742. The staff have been working to engage and house 24 individuals who have been literally homeless (in a shelter, on the streets or somewhere unfit for human occupancy, such as an abandoned building) for 90-days or more. Four (4) of those individuals meet the chronically homeless criteria, which means they have a diagnosable disability AND have been homeless for at least 1 year or have been homeless 4 times in the past 3 years, totaling 365 days.

There are 376 total participants currently receiving housing and/or services.

The need for 1-bedroom units for single individuals is still dire!

We have implemented several staff promotions given the additional responsibilities that have been added to their job descriptions. Currently we have 3 openings: Piatt County Coordinator, 2nd Shift Shelter Specialist and Domestic Violence Shelter Maintenance Specialist. (see doveinc.org for job descriptions)

Request for shelter and orders of protection has significantly increased. The past 2 weeks the need for Orders of Protection has skyrocketed. A total of 18 Emergency Orders of Protection and 12 Plenary Orders were completed!

Teri Ducy, Program Director

The Family Violence Coordinating Council continues to move forward. The overall goal of this Council is to improve the criminal justice response to family violence in our community. Four committees are forming out of this full Council and are in the process of having their first meetings. These committees are:

Law Enforcement/Prosecution Lethality & Risk Assessment Committee

- Brings together professionals from law enforcement, State Attorney's Office, service providers etc. to address issues related to prosecution of perpetrators
- The intent of this team is to create annual goals and projects to achieve those goals. This year's project will include the creation and implementation of risk assessment tools geared toward identifying high risk perpetrators of family violence in our community

Rehabilitative Protected Service Committee

- Brings together professionals from State's Attorney Office, Public Defender's Office, Probation, private & government attorneys, services providers, etc. to address issues related to rehabilitation of perpetrators
- The intent of this team is to create annual goals to create successful methods of rehabilitating perpetrators of family violence in the community

Community Engagement and Training Safety Committee

- Implements grant required council training activities and promote awareness for family violence in the community
- Focuses on researching, developing, scheduling and presenting training for council members, first respondents, and community outreach

Data Analysis Committee

- History has shown that childhood physical and sexual abuses were significantly associated with partner violence. Collection of reported family violence will help shed light on the prevalence, causes, and consequences of all types of family violence. Reliable statistics are essential in developing effective governmental responses and program service performance
- The intent of this team is to identify ways to improve data collection, reporting and sharing of data analysis with council members
- Collected statistics should include but not limited to: numbers of prosecutions, convictions, denials of prosecutions, orders for protection issued, and re-offense data

- Driver's License or other Photo I.D. and copy of current Ameren Illinois utility bill
- Applicant must reside at the address on the bill and have active service in his or her name
- Income eligibility, see guidelines in the box
- Applicant can receive WNCF assistance only once per heating season, which is 10/1 to 5/31 each year and once per cooling season, 6/1 to 9/30
- WNCF matches customer payments (within the last 45 days) up to \$350 during heating season and up to \$200 during cooling season
- Heating grants are based solely on income guide-lines while cooling grants are intended for seniors, disabled or those with medical conditions exacerbated by heat (with a doctor's letter)
