News from Homeward Bound

The staff have been working to engage and house 23 individuals who have been literally homeless (in a shelter, on the streets or somewhere unfit for human occupancy, such as an abandoned building) for 90-days or more. Four (3) of those individuals meet the chronically homeless criteria, which means they have a diagnosable disability AND have been homeless for at least 1 year or have been homeless 4 times in the past 3 years, totaling 365 days.

There are 789 total participants currently receiving housing and/or services

The need for 1-bedroom units for single individuals is still dire!

Well, August has certainly been a busy month here at Dove. I hope all of you are staying healthy and safe and that you're staying cool in the heat.

We may be amid a heatwave, but I'm thinking cool thoughts and dreaming about Christmas.

The first piece of news regarding our baskets program is that we have both a new name and a new logo! The logo debuted in last month's newsletter, created by Dove's Director of Volunteers and Community Relations, Barb Blakey. It really highlights our partnerships with Northeast Community Fund, Salvation Army, and the community who is so generous with their donations of time, money, gifts, and food.

The new title, Christmas Care and Share, gets right at the heart of what we aim to do with the program – care about others and share our resources, share our love of people – with as many others as we can.

After meeting with the planning committee for the program, and meeting with Salvation Army and Northeast Community Fund, we decided to give gifts once more to kids up to age 17. We are also going to give away some of the bigger ticket items (such as bikes, scooters, riding toys, and hoverboards) in a lottery to make sure everyone has equal opportunity at those items. We always want to be as fair as possible, and this feels like the best way to go about it with those gifts.

As for location, we don't know for certain yet where we will be assembling and distributing baskets this year. Last year as most of you know, we utilized the former Kroger in Fairview Plaza, which worked out great for multiple reasons, but it also came with a hefty

price tag that none of our agencies can afford to pay again. Our tentative plan is – we are hoping to utilize the gymnasium at Salvation Army. However, now, there is construction going on at their shelter and their clients are sleeping in said gymnasium. The construction folks are hopeful that construction will be done by October, but with the struggle to get supplies, workers, and the ongoing pandemic, they just don't know for sure at this point.

So much of this month has been dedicated to trying to find a Plan B. There are a few things up in the air as possibilities, but nothing concrete yet.

Initially we were set to meet with agency and school representatives on September 13 to give them their referrals to take back to their agencies and schools to decide which of their families needed assistance the most. We like to give them ample time to do that, and to contact their families and distribute the information and get it back to us before crunch time (when we make the move from working in the office to working wherever we're setting up for assembly and distribution). We have now pushed that meeting date to October 6, and made it a Zoom meeting, both for convenience's sake and to give us more time to see if construction will be finished up at the Salvation Army. Please say a prayer that it is, as it really is our best option at this point.

We're always in need of homemade stockings and warm items for kids (hats, gloves, scarves), and also would love to receive rolls of tape for wrapping gifts. One area we struggle in is stocking stuffers for preteen and teen boys. Something that's right around the corner is Halloween and those giant bags of mixed candies make GREAT stocking stuffers for kids of all ages – so if you wanted to grab an extra bag when you grab one for the kiddos in your neighborhood, we'd appreciate that very much.

Moultrie County Dove Domestic Violence Program provides comprehensive assistance and support to all victims of domestic violence. All services are free and confidential. The program is designed to keep victims and children safe, and all services are offered in a nonjudgmental atmosphere. We provide emergency shelter, legal advocacy, children's services, parenting education & teen dating education. Crisis support information and referrals are given to those who call the office and the 24hour hotline. Services are provided to victims in Sullivan, Bethany, Lovington, Dalton City, La Place, Kirksville, Allenville, and Arthur. The Support Groups is Thursdays, 5:00 p.m. If you know someone who would benefit, please call Becky, 217.728.9303, for more information.

We accepts donations of new toiletries and hygiene products, such as shampoo, conditioner, soap, body wash, deodorant, razors, feminine hygiene products, toothpaste, & toothbrushes. Victims of domestic violence are often forced to leave their home due to the violence and have no choice but to leave all their belongings behind. We also accept new baby items such as diapers, baby powder, baby wash & wet wipes. Baby items can often be expensive, and victims of domestic violence often rely on their abuser's income, especially after just having a baby. Things like finding employment, getting court ordered child support or getting TANF can take some time, and SNAP benefits will not cover the cost of these items, so we keep them on hand.

In recognition of National Domestic Violence Awareness month, our Candlelighting Ceremony will be Thursday October 21, 6:00 p.m. at First Christian Church, 1357 CR 1200 E, Sullivan.

It really is hard to put into words what an impact Ray Batman has made in my life. Words that jump out that make it very easy to describe the kind of man he was – Genuine, Honest, Trustworthy, Wise, Compassionate, Integrity, Respectful, Witty – I could go on and on – you get the picture. I am blessed with so many fond memories, some of which make me laugh and others that bring tears. I will name a few:

Just prior to 2000, I recall Ray approaching me about the idea of the domestic violence program expanding further into 3 additional counties – Piatt, Moultrie and Shelby. DeWitt had been open since 1990. With only 2 years being the director of the DV Program, I had lots to learn. It was a very busy time, finding locations for the 3 new county offices, hiring 3 new County Coordinators (I recall us receiving hundreds of applications/resumes), hiring of a Multi County Rural Manager, first being Jean Wood, later being Vivian Reed. Ray had such great vision; I will always miss his guidance.

2003 was a very difficult year for me personally. On April 11th, my Mom passed away after only being diagnosed with cancer for 3 weeks. She had been healthy and just thought she may have had a cold – but obviously it was way more than that. The day after we buried her, my youngest sister died at the age of 39. Funerals for both my Mom and my sister – all in the same week. But Ray. Ray was there. He brought me more strength during this time than I can begin to say. And – given the kind of good man that he was, as everyone agrees, Ray had just lost his dear wife, Nancy Jo, 3 months before. He was still grieving.....but he was there for me. I am so thankful I was able to share with him many times just how thankful I was to him during this most difficult time in my life. He was a pillar of strength to me – loving, supportive, and one of the best listeners I will ever meet.

In 2007, I recall just walking through the hallway in our old shelter at 788 E. Clay, passing Ray, and him stopping me and out of the blue asked "what are your thoughts about moving the domestic violence shelter?" WHAT!?!? This wasn't even on our radar. We had been in this building since 1987 and we were very comfortable there. But once again – Ray's vision. We had many meetings and made it all happen – we survived the move – it was a huge undertaking – but what a blessing our current facility at 302 S. Union has and continues to be for us! Again – Ray's vision – his connections. Another sad time – 2010 – when I lost my husband, Bill, after his 4 year fight with cancer. Again – Ray was there – I remember expressing to him my concern about me missing some work (Bill had been put on hospice on January 21st, 2010, and died on March 8th) and Ray's response was "take care of Bill, he comes first". Bill and Ray had a great friendship. Many times Bill would just "pop" in to Ray's office when he was over on E. Clay St. I think maybe Bill thought Ray had all the time in the world, because he would just go in and make himself comfortable and start telling stories. I am sure that when Ray would see Bill pulling into the parking lot he probably said something like "oh no…..here comes Ducy!"

And then there is the April Fools stories!! LOL This is one of my favorite days and the staff at Dove all know that. Ray was often one of my favorite people to "trick". My favorite story is the one in April of 2010. Honestly, I wasn't even going to do anything that year, because my Mom was not doing well - but something inside me wouldn't let the day go by without doing something. So....on my lunch hour one day when we were having our monthly all Dove Staff Meeting, I stopped into Dominos Pizza and asked if one of their workers would like to make a little extra money that day? So....I arranged for this worker to show up at Dove, at a certain time, shortly after our Dove staff meeting had began. He showed up and came downstairs to the room full of Dove staff, carrying about 4 "pizzas", still in their warmers, and said "I have the pizzas" for Ray Batman" and Ray looked up, rather confused, and told him he was Ray, but that he didn't know anything about any pizzas. The worker said "well, are you Ray Batman, at 800 E. Clay and is the phone number here 428-6616?" Ray, still confused, answered "Yeeessss....but I still don't know about these pizzas." He asked him how much they were and as the Dominos worker was telling him the cost, Ray started to actually reach for his wallet. At this point - I am sitting about 3-4 seats from him on his left and I knew I had to step in – at this point - so I interrupted and said "Um....Ray.....April Fools!!!!" The entire room broke out in laughter – by the way - the "pizzas" inside the pizza warmers were actually empty pizza boxes!!

Another April Fools Day – when Ray arrived at his office, he was surprised to find probably at least 100+ paper cups full of water – all stapled together – some on the floor – all over the top of his desk – making it pretty tricky on how he was going

to undo this contraption without spilling the water! I never did hear how that turned out!

Ray did not like rats – at all!! Another April Fools Day – I put a large ugly rubber rat, that is attached to a big rat trap, inside his desk drawer. I arranged it just so-so – so that when he opened the drawer – it would set this thing off – and sure enough it did – I heard him open the drawer only to hear that big ugly rat squeaking loudly and flopping around inside his drawer! (I'm pretty sure Ray might have had to use the restroom after that one!!) LOL

But the April Fools was also on me a couple times – when Ray arranged to cover my entire vehicle with saran wrap!!!! So when I went out to go get in my car after work, all ready to end my day and head home – only to find my "gift wrapped" vehicle – which I will admit took me quite awhile to remove all the saran wrap so I could leave!!! Another car story – is the year he hid my car on April Fools Day – don't have a clue to this day how he got my keys – but when I left work, my car was gone! I found it all the way in the back of the church next door at the back lower end of their parking lot.

Ohhhh the memories....I have so many. I am grateful for every one. Thank you, Ray. You were my mentor, my confidant, my friend. I will always treasure our conversations. I will always cherish every dinner at the Wagon with you and Missy. What a beautiful love story you shared with her. I am so thankful for all the times you listened to my silly questions; for all your wise advice over the years; you were there to offer any support I needed – in many challenging times over the years, even after you retired from Dove – but I always knew I could come to you – to talk about things – get your input – your advice – you had so much knowledge – and I knew you were one who I could trust – you proved that. You are now walking those streets of gold – and our community – our Dove family - is in a better place – because of you. Fly high with the angels, my friend....on the wings of a Dove.
