She recalled a family member enjoying the Life Center. "My Aunt Jessie Burton came here a lot, but I didn't know anybody when I started coming here. They accepted me. I found a lot of friends," she said. "When I was married, Jerry's friends were my friends. It was all (about) Jerry."

In her lifetime, she has held a variety of jobs including working for a major tax preparation agency for 15 years and bartending. She also worked as the manager in an automotive store. "I didn't believe that men could do more than I could," she said with a laugh. She has this advice for anyone else in her shoes. "If you're afraid like I was, just do it. I have made so many friends. It's amazing."
