MEDICARE PART D OPEN ENROLLMENT OCTOBER 15 THRU DECEMBER 7, 2018

Beginning on Monday, October 15, 2018 through Friday, December 7, 2018, those with Medicare Part D plans will have their annual opportunity enroll in or to change Medicare Part D prescription drug plans. The Outreach Counselors at the Senior Center can assist anyone interested in investigating the various options in choosing a more cost effective plan. There are changes in place for 2018 and the Senior Center, the Macon County Health Department and CHELP are offering special enrollment events during October, November and December designed to assist seniors enrolling in prescription drug plans and options.



Even if you are satisfied with your current Medicare coverage, it is wise to look at other Medicare options that may better suit your individual needs in the upcoming year. For example, you should check to see if there is another plan in the area that will offer you better health and/or drug coverage at a more affordable price. Research shows that people with Medicare prescription drug coverage (Part D) could lower their costs by shopping among plans each year; there could be another Part D plan in the area that covers the drugs you take with fewer restrictions and/or lower prices. 4. What are some things I should consider when choosing a Part D prescription drug plan? Ask yourself the following questions before choosing a Part D drug plan: Does the plan cover all the medications I'm taking? Does the plan restrict my access to drugs (i.e. prior authorization, step therapy, or quantity limits)? How much will I pay for monthly premiums and the annual deductible? How much will I pay at the pharmacy (copay/coinsurance) for each drug I take? Is my pharmacy in the plan's preferred network? (You pay the least if you use preferred network pharmacies.) Can I fill my prescriptions by mail order? If I have retiree coverage, will

the Medicare drug plan work with this coverage? What is the plan's star rating? The Senior Center's Outreach Counselors are trained to use Medicare's Plan Finder tool, which can give you a comprehensive list of Medicare Advantage and Part D plans, the drugs they cover, and their estimated costs for the year. You can access Plan Finder yourself by going online at www.medicare.gov. You can also call 1-800-MEDICARE for information about plans and prices. Finally, you can receive objective, one-on-one assistance from our State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) counselors at the Senior Center.

MEDICARE PART D PRESCRIPTION DRUG INFORMATIONAL COFFEE WITH JUDY & ELAINE

The Decatur-Macon County Senior Center will present a Medicare Part D prescription drug Informational Coffee on Wednesday, October 10, 2018 from 9am to 10am at the Senior Center. People with questions concerning the Part D program or with other topics of concern are invited to attend this event at 9am. Coffee and donuts will be served. This presentation is free and open to the public.

MEDICARE PART D EXTRA HELP AND MEDICARE SAVINGS PROGRAMS

Medicare beneficiaries can qualify for Extra Help (from Social Security) with their Medicare prescription drug plan costs. To qualify for the Extra Help, a person must be receiving Medicare, have limited resources and income, and reside in one of the 50 States or the District of Columbia.

There is financial help for those on Medicare & Medicaid or on Medicare up to 150% of the federal poverty level towards paying for Medicare Part D premiums and cost shares. The Senior Center has the requirements and can assist you in accessing the help. Please call the Senior Center for an appointment at 429-1239.

DMCOC HEATING ASSISTANCE

DMCOC staff will be at the Senior Center to assist senior citizens in applying for LIHEAP heating assistance on October 22, 2018. Please call the Senior Center at 429-1239 after October 1 to schedule an appointment. Income guidelines to qualify for assistance are based on 150% of the federal poverty level. For a one person household the income standard is a monthly income of \$1508 or an annual income up to \$18,090. The requirement for a two person household to qualify for assistance is a monthly income of no more than \$2,030 or an annual income of \$24,360. When you apply for assistance, bring the following with you:

- Proof of gross income from all household members for the 30-day period prior to the application date, types of income include, but are not limited to: pay stubs, Social Security (SSA, SSI & SSDI). Veterans benefits, unemployment, TANF, AABD, & Child Support.
- Copy of your current heat and electric bills (if you pay for your home energy directly)
- Proof of Social Security Numbers, you must bring Social Security cards for all household members.
- If a member of your household receives TANF, you must bring their "Medical Eligibility Card."
- If you rent, bring proof of your rental agreement that must state your monthly rent amount, or proof of home ownership with your address on it.

Admission is \$20, which includes 15 games and door prizes including 3 intermission games and a cover-all game. We will also have refreshments, 50/50 drawing, prize raffle and a silent auction. FLU SHOT & BLOOD PRESSURE CLINIC SCHEDULED

The Macon County Health Department will conduct a Flu Shot Clinic at the Senior Center on October 16, 2018 from 9am-11:00am. Mary Margaret Robinson, LPN, will be doing a free blood pressure screening at the same time as the flu shot clinic. There is no cost for the flu shots for those on Medicare or Medicaid. Those individuals 65 years old and over will receive the High Dose flu shot. Those people 65 and older not on Medicare or without insurance the charge for the High Dose shot is \$65. People under the age of 65 will be offered the regular flu shot at

a cost of \$40 for those without insurance or Medicare/Medicaid. Those interested in receiving the Shingles vaccine may do so by appointment at the Health Department by calling 423-6988, ext. 1333. The Health Department will also have information about the pneumonia vaccine. If you are not yet on Medicare nor have insurance coverage please contact the Health Department at 423-6988, ext. 1333. Please wear short sleeves and bring your Medicare/Medicaid card when you come. It is especially stressed that persons in the high risk groups, household contacts or caregivers for persons in the high risk groups receive the shots because they are at greater risk for complications from influenza disease. The high risk groups include: persons age 50 years or older, especially those 65 and over; anyone with a chronic medical condition such as diabetes, hypertension, emphysema or other condition affecting the heart, lungs or immune system; and, all children 6 months to 18 years of age.

The Macon County Supervisor of Assessments office wants to remind everyone who has the Senior Citizens Assessment Freeze Exemption that the deadline for your annual renewal is November 1. If you haven't renewed this year please bring your 2017 federal tax return with 1099's to the Assessor's office and they will assist you in completing the form. If you have never filed, you are 65 or older and your total household income is less than \$55,000 you may qualify for this exemption. SOCIAL SECURITY COLUMN **Social Security and Medicare,** **Working Side by Side**

Social Security and Medicare have worked side by side for decades. Both programs have improved the quality of life for millions of Americans.

Social Security reaches almost every family and, at some point, touches the lives of nearly all Americans. We're with you through life's journey — from birth to your golden years. Social Security helps older Americans, workers who become disabled, and families in which a spouse or parent dies. In 2017, about 174 million people worked and paid Social Security taxes and about 62 million people received monthly Social Security benefits.

We want you to understand what Social Security can mean to you and your family's financial future. The publication, *Understanding the Benefits*, explains the basics of the Social Security retirement, disability, and survivors insurance programs. You can read it at www.socialsecurity.gov/pubs/EN-05-10024.pdf.

Unlike workers in the private sector, not all state or local government employees are covered by Social Security. Some only have their public pension coverage, and other government employees have both a public pension and Social Security coverage. For more information, please read our publication titled *How State and Local Government Employees are Covered by Social Security and Medicare* at www.socialsecurity.gov/pubs/EN-05-10051.pdf.

Medicare is the federal health insurance program for people who are 65 or older and certain younger people with disabilities. It is also for people with End-Stage Renal Disease (permanent kidney failure requiring dialysis or a transplant, sometimes called ESRD).

The different parts of Medicare help cover specific services. Medicare Part A (hospital insurance) helps pay for inpatient hospital stays, care in a skilled nursing facility, hospice care, and some home health care. Medicare Part B (medical insurance) helps pay for certain doctors' services, outpatient care, medical supplies, and some preventive services.

Medicare Part C (Medicare Advantage plans) is a type of Medicare health plan offered by a private company that contracts with Medicare. Medicare Advantage plans provide all of your Part A and Part B benefits. Medicare Advantage plans may also include Medicare Part D (prescription drug coverage). Part D helps cover the cost of prescription drugs. Some people with limited resources and income may also be

able to get Extra Help with the costs — monthly premiums, annual deductibles, and prescription co-payments — related to a Medicare prescription drug plan. The Extra Help is estimated to be worth about \$4,900 per year. You must meet the resources and income requirements.

When you apply for Medicare, you can sign up for Part A (hospital insurance) and Part B (medical insurance). Because you must pay a premium for Part B coverage, you can turn it down. However, if you decide to enroll in Part B later on, you may have to pay a late enrollment penalty for as long as you have Part B coverage. Your monthly premium will go up 10 percent for each 12-month period you were eligible for Part B, but didn't sign up for it, unless you qualify for a special enrollment period.

Question:

I need to make changes to my Medicare prescription drug coverage. When can I do that?

Answer:

Open season for Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage runs from October 15 to December 7. The Medicare Part D prescription drug program is available to all Medicare beneficiaries. Joining a Medicare prescription drug plan is voluntary and participants pay an additional monthly premium. If you are considering changing your plan, you might want to revisit the Application for Extra Help with Medicare Prescription Drug Plan Costs. If you have limited resources and income, you may also be eligible for Extra Help to pay monthly premiums, annual deductibles, and prescription co-payments. Extra Help is estimated to be worth about \$4,000 per year. To find out more, visit www.socialsecurity.gov/prescriptionhelp. Question:

I worked the first half of the year, but plan to retire this month. Will Social Security count the amount I earn for this year when I retire?

Answer:

Yes. If you retire mid-year, we count your earnings for the entire year. We have a special "earnings test" rule we apply to annual earnings, usually in the first year of retirement. Under this rule, you get a full payment for any whole month we consider you retired regardless of your yearly earnings. We consider you retired during any month your earnings are below the monthly earnings limit, or if you have not performed substantial services in self-employment. We do not consider income earned, beginning with the month you reach full retirement age. Learn more about the earnings test rule at www.socialsecurity.gov/retire2/rule.htm.
