2020 Census Operational Adjustments Due to COVID-19

The 2020 Census is underway and households across America are responding every day. Online, phone and mailed self-responses will continue throughout the data collection process. Considering the COVID-19 outbreak, the U.S. Census Bureau is adjusting 2020 Census operations in order to:

- Protect the health and safety of Census employees and the American public.
- Implement guidance from federal, state, and local health authorities.
- Ensure a complete and accurate count of all communities.

Under the adjusted 2020 Census operational plan, field activities would resume after June 1, 2020, as Area Census Offices begin returning to full staff capacity. Inperson activities, including enumeration, office work, and processing activities, will incorporate the most current guidance from authorities to ensure the health and safety of staff and the public. Everyone should have received a mailing Census response card.

Long-Term Care Facilities (E-Response & Paper Enumeration)

Many Long-Term Care facilities have already begun responding through our e-Response enumeration option.

Census Workers Canvasing

Census takers drop off invitations to respond and paper questionnaires at the front doors of 5 million households stateside while updating the addresses.

Nonresponse Follow-up (NRFU)

Census takers will interview households in person. New dates will cover areas previously scheduled for "Early NRFU."

Long-Term Care facilities that remain as part of our in-person group quarters enumeration efforts will begin in July.


